SNU has exchange agreements with over 230 universities in 30 countries around the world. Students may apply to study at any of these universities either as exchange or visiting students. In addition, they may participate in any of the following global programs during their enrollment at SNU.

### Asia in Today's World Program

SNU students may take summer courses in Asian Studies at Kyushu University in Japan. Students do not need to be majors in Asian Studies in order to apply.

### APRU (Association of Pacific Rim Universities) Undergraduate Summer Program

Students may earn three credits taking summer courses at APRU (Association of Pacific Rim Universities) member

### Harvard-Yenching Program (Harvard University) The Harvard-Yenching Institute provides research funding for

doctoral students and faculty members nominated by SNU.

Seoul-Tokyo-Peking International Summer School Students selected from Korea, Japan and China spend one week in SNU, one week in Waseda University and one week in Peking University, participating in seminars on political and economic issues and field trips for three weeks in total.

### **Seoul National University International Summer** Institute (SNU ISI)

Seoul National University International Summer Institute offers an exceptional opportunity for students to study with worldrenown scholars. Brilliant intellectual minds from all over the world come together to guide ISI students through six weeks of intensive courses in their fields of expertise. ISI courses are conducted entirely in English. Lectures arecombined with field trips to cultural sites and an optional Korean language program to make the summer experience an exciting crosscultural encounter.

### Stanford & Yale Summer Program

SNU students have the opportunity to take summer courses while learning languages at Stanford or Yale University during the summer break. Approximately 30 students participate in this program each year. Eligible SNU students may take regular summer courses at Yale University. At Stanford University SNU students may participate in extra-curricular activities together with Stanford students.



### **Work Abroad**

SNU also provides students with the opportunity to work overseas and improve their competitiveness in the global market. The following are two popular internship programs.


### **Global Talent Program**

The SNU Career Development Center (CDC) provides undergraduate and graduate students with the opportunity to apply their academic knowledge in the global work environment. The CDC provides development training to selected students, helping them locate and secure internship opportunities abroad. It also provides students with Global Talent Awards to help students meet expenses incurred during overseas internships.

### Vashington Leadership Program

KASM (Korean American Sharing Movement, Inc.), a nonprofit organization in the US, selects talented Korean University students and Korean American students to help them develop into next-generation leaders around the world. The Washington Leadership Program offers a systematic leadership training program during the summer months. SNU provides 50% of the education cost per student.





### I SNU's Yearly Ranking in the World by **Number of SCI Publications**


